


Proposed Easement Agreement - Oakland City to West End Station





Proposed Easement Agreement - White Oak Street @ Lee St.









Proposed Easement Agreement - Dimmock Street @ Lee Street








Proposed Easement Agreement – Donnelly Street @ Lee Street








Proposed Easement Agreement – White Street @ Lee Street









Overview

- Georgia DOT selected a new P3 private revenue procurement process combining the I-285 Express Lane from I-20 on the west, across the top end and to I-20 on the east
- ATL provided sponsor funds for this I-285
 Top End BRT Planning Study to include
 ATL, MARTA, GDOT, ARC, Cobb and
 Gwinnett Counties



















Planning Study Services

- Management for visioning, scoping, planning and conceptual engineering
- Public engagement and stakeholder communications
- Coordination with GDOT for components that will coincide with the I-285 Top End Express Lanes MMIP Initiative
- Preferred alternative studies and identification
- Environmental review and analysis
- Capital cost estimates
- Study and recommendations documentation



Draft Schedule



Status

- RFP was advertised December 1, 2022
- On January 30, 2023, the Source Evaluation Committee (SEC) received three (3) qualification statements, two (2) were deemed responsive
- SEC reviewed and scored the responsive proposals between February 10-16, 2023
- Vendor presentations (top 2 proponents) were held on February 28, 2023
- The SEC reconvened on March 3, 2023 and recommended the award to the most qualified proponent





Background

Planning & Project Development is responsible for the planning, design, and monitoring of bus and rail services; conducting long-range planning which includes ridership modeling, identifying future locations for capital expansion projects, and guiding system expansion projects from initiation through conceptual design, utilizing local and various federal funding processes.



MARTA Board authorized the Planning Support & Technical Services Contract, P39820, in 2018 as a key component in the delivery of the MORE MARTA Expansion program.

Consultant services provide critical support for the development and implementation of Planning & Project Developments' core functions.

GPC Contract Overview

- Supports MARTA Planning Services and Project Implementation
- Advances MARTA 2040 expansion program and state of good repair projects
- Contract amount: \$76M
- Contract length: 3yr base-term + 2 one-year options
- DBE goal: 25%





GPC Contract Description

Provide support for six key functional Planning areas:

- Transit Corridor and Facility Planning
- Communications/Community Engagement
- Transit Service Planning
- Policy Planning
- Community, Environment, and Innovation
- Grant Writing





Contract Status

- RFP was solicited November 16, 2022.
- The Source Evaluation Committee (SEC) received 6 proposals on January 18, 2023; scoring was completed by February 13, 2023.
- Presentations were held on March 2,
 2023 for top scoring proposals.
- Final recommendation for the award of the GPC was decided by the SEC on March 16, 2023.





Staff Recommendations

- The SEC recommended a multi-recipient award to three (3) firms.
- The contract value is \$76M for a three (3) year base term with two (2) one year options.
- The DBE goal is 25% for each awarded firm and shall be maintained for the duration of the agreement.



Today's Objective

Approval of a policy framework that shapes the bus network redesign project and guides upcoming work to plan the new bus network.



Resolution Overview

The resolution:

- Affirms the need for a comprehensive bus network redesign
- Sets a balance between ridership (75-80%) and coverage (20-25%)
- Incorporates the Guiding Principles and Overriding Considerations
- Defines Clayton County's role in the project





Ridership/Coverage Policy

Proposed Resolution

75-80% ridership 20-25% coverage

Existing System

60% ridership 40% coverage

The proposed resolution is based on staff recommendations and public engagement...

More ridership?

Ridership Concept

90% ridership 10% coverage

Coverage Concept

70% ridership 30% coverage

...or more coverage?

...and moves towards ridership while preserving resources for key coverage needs.



Guiding Principles

Expand Access	Expand access to opportunity, so that more people find bus service useful, leading more people to ride, which advances inclusive economic development, environmental stewardship, and positive fiscal impact.
Equity	Go beyond ensuring there are no disparate negative impacts for historically disadvantaged communities by providing quality bus service to reduce disparities, which benefits the entire region in linking access, equity, and growth.
Future Facing	Plan for the community now and in the future, not for the travel patterns of the past.
Balance	Find the right balance between the competing goals of ridership and coverage.
Challenges	Accept that while the network will be a net improvement, some customers will object to the changes.



Next Steps



With the approval of this resolution, the project can proceed into the Draft Network Planning phase.

Once a draft network is developed, we will provide an update briefing to Board members.



Next Steps



Spring 2023 – develop Draft Network Plan



Summer 2023 – public engagement on Draft Network Plan, refinement, equity analysis



Fall 2023 – with Board approval of the Final Network Plan, at least 6 months of intensive preparation and public education




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
Resolution to Approve the Locally Preferred Alternative for the Atlanta Streetcar East Extension Project



Overview

- MARTA seeks approval of the Locally Preferred Alternative for the Atlanta Streetcar East Extension Project.
- The selected alignment will include:
 - Shared transit/roadway lanes
 - Dedicated Atlanta Beltline trackway
 - 5 proposed station stops (10 platforms)
 - Expansion of the existing System/Vehicle Maintenance Facility











State of MARTA Train Control






Existing automatic train control (ATC) system has original equipment, 40 years old, operates with fixed blocks of vehicle separation for safety.

- Track circuits and fixed blocks are proven technology, failsafe and function properly
- Majority of MOW delays are due to ATC issues
- System maintenance is hindered by reduced manufacturer support and replacement parts
- Delays will continue to increase as equipment ages and becomes obsolete
- Fixed block system only 2 suppliers: Hitachi & Alstom
 - Union Switch & Signal Ansaldo now Hitachi
 - Older generation equipment not supported with limited spare parts options



Communications Based Train Control - CBTC

- Existing system operates in a fixed block train operation limited by block size and layout
- "Occupancy" and fixed block length determines train operation spacing



- Moving block (CBTC) train continually reports location
- More precise train location (with respect to fixed block) allows for shorter train operation spacing



CBTC Advantages

- Additional vendor options: Siemens, Thales, Hitachi, Alstom, Mitsubishi, Stadler
 - Less reliance on limited supported technology
- Wayside equipment reduction (up to 40%)
- Overall reduction of maintenance impacts to revenue service
- Improved train location
 - Movement of trains back to yards more efficiently
 - Potential improved tunnel ventilation system response
 - Train service schedule improvements

CBTC Disadvantages

- New work force skillsets
- Central control system replacement
- Additional rail vehicle installation
 - New rail vehicles currently specified to interface with existing train control and single vendor CBTC hardware
 - Vehicle hardware not compatible with other vendor software
- System transition more complicated
- Need for long-term vendor support

RFP Considerations

- Going to industry to solicit vendors for their potential at MARTA
- A performance-based format
- Allows vendors to demonstrate how they can meet our needs
- Does not limit vendors to a pre-selected plan
- Promotes industry competition
- Potential saving in reduced schedule for implementation
- Will establish a program to meet the needs of our future system
 - Mapping out the costs for design, installation, O&M and schedule







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Automated Transit Network (ATN) Solicitation

What is Automated Transit Network (ATN)?

- On-demand or scheduled service
- 1 vehicle, accommodating 1-6 passengers
- 15-25 mph average speed
- Network (typical) or corridor configuration
- Rubber tire on concrete, suspended steel rail or supported steel rail
- On-board battery or electric third rail








Background

- Partnership with the ATL Airport Community Improvement Districts (AACIDs)
- Serve Clayton and South Fulton County by improving mobility and reducing pollution and greenhouse gases
- Research conducted on automated guideway technologies, including Automated Transit Network (ATN)
- Understand feasibility and project-specific objectives
- 75-100 stations with alignments identified in the study area
- Pilot project 5-25 stations for initial deployment







Automated Transit Network (ATN) Pilot Project

- Connection between Domestic and International Terminals at the Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport
- Develop the process, documentation and plans necessary to select and procure the preferred vendor
- Evaluate bids and recommend award to the best-qualified team
- Allow bidders to suggest alternative layouts, structures, operational and payment/profit sharing methodologies
- Serve as a basis for expanding the project as needed by providing similar services to those for additional phased expansion projects
